ADVANCE NOTICE - SUNDAY'S GOSPEL

On Sunday we will hear the Gospel story of Jesus' ascension into Heaven. Having risen from the dead six weeks ago and appearing to the disciples throughout this time to reassure them that they must go out and spread the good news of God's love to all nations, Jesus is now leaving them to be with His Father in Heaven. This Gospel story helps us to reflect on how we are spreading the good news of God's love in our daily lives.

SICKNESS BUG

A number of parents have reported that their child is absent from school today because of sickness and diarrhoea. We have also sent 3 children home from school this morning because of this same condition. We do ask and advise that any child who has sickness and diarrhoea should not return to school until they are free of symptoms for 48 hours following their last bout of sickness or diarrhoea. This will ensure that the spread of infection is kept isolated and helps to prevent spread of the illness. Give your child frequent sips of water to prevent <u>dehydration</u> and seek medical advice if you are concerned about your child's symptoms.

COTSWOLD FARM PARK TRIP
