CORE VALUES

MUSIC WEEK

This week in school, classes from Reception to Year 5 have all had a music day! It has been a fantastic chance for the children to listen to music, compose and perform. The children discussed and used lots of musical vocabulary such as pitch, dynamics, duration, timbre and tempo. It has been so exciting to hear music played all round the school and to see the children so excited by what they have been learning.

In Reception the children read "We're Going on a Bear Hunt" and matched our instruments to the sounds in the story.

In Year 1 the children read "The Night Pirates" and wrote their own music based on part of the story.

In Year 2 the children read "The Night Pirates" and wrote their own music based on their favourite part of the story.

In Year 3 the children read "The Great Kapok Tree" and composed their own music to create rainforest sounds.

In Year 4 the children wrote their own rainforest themed songs.

In Year 5 the children read "The Wizard of Oz" and wrote their own songs based on the story.
