Hello... We hope you've all been making the most of the sunshine that we have been having and have got everything crossed that it continues! By now, families with children due to start school in September will have received their primary/infant-junior school allocation and accepted the place or requested a reconsideration. Read on for more information including key dates and what happens next.

Primary/Infant-Junior Admissions

If you have requested a reconsideration for your child's school place, the outcome of these will be available after Friday 15th May.

The closing date for the return of reconsideration reply forms is Friday 29th May.

If a place is offered under reconsideration, your original offer will be withdrawn and given to another child immediately. This place then cannot be offered back to you.

If you are unsuccessful in gaining a place at the reconsideration stage, you have a legal right to appeal if you think you have exceptional circumstances supporting why your child should have a place at your preferred school. The appeals procedure involves completing and returning an appeal form and your case will be decided by an Independent Appeal Panel at a meeting to which you are invited. The appeals will usually be held from June.

Online Check - Free Fun and Learning for 2 year Olds

Do you receive benefits or working tax credits and have an annual household income of less than £16,190? If so, your child may be entitled to a funded place at a childcare setting of your choice for up to 15 hours a week (term time).

You can now check if you are entitled by visiting our new Citizen Portal (www.gcca2vofunding.com) after your child's second birthday. Once you have registered on the portal, you will be able to input all the relevant information and the system will advise if you are eligible. Please ensure that you have your National Insurance number to hand.

Children may also be entitled to statutory funding if they meet one of the following:

- They have a Education Health and Care Plan (EHCP) or a current statement of Special Educational Needs
- The child is in receipt of Disability Living Allowance
- They are in the care of the Local Authority or they have left care through special guardianship, adoption order or child arrangements order

You can submit an application for statutory funding by using the same citizen portal.



The Key is a special, proactive information service for any family in Gloucestershire with a disabled child or young person (from birth to twenty five years). Key members benefit from receiving information that is customised to each family, depending on the child's abilities and interests, disabilities, age and location. Any family with a child with additional needs, medical or educational, can join The Key, or leave it, at any time they wish. It is completely FREE and CONFIDENTIAL. The Key are also able to help with networking between families for mutual support when consent is given. Members can also receive free leisure passes.
