HOLY WEEK

Next week all children will be learning about Holy Week, which commemorates the Passion Of Christ. All children will be involved in our Palm Sunday service on Monday morning (9.05am), the 'Hour of Prayer' (which is organised by the Chaplaincy Reps and takes place throughout the whole day) on Tuesday, our Last Supper service on Wednesday morning (9.15am) and the Stations of the Cross service on Thursday morning at 9.15am. Parents are welcome to attend the services.
