<u>IMPORTANT INFORMATION - RAILWAY CROSSING ON HORTON ROAD</u>

Network Rail have informed us that from 12 September until 21 October 2016 the level crossing in Horton Road will have an increase in the amount of freight and high speed trains passing through due to diversion of trains from the Severn Tunnel network. Please allow extra time to travel as the barriers will be down a lot more often than usual. Please remind your child(ren) of railway crossing safety. Many thanks.

VACCINE UPDATE/REMINDER

To give your child the best protection against Measles, Mumps and Rubella a child needs two doses. This is because the vaccine does not always work fully the first time. Therefore if your child has not had a second MMR as part of pre-school vaccines, I would encourage you to do this now by contacting your GP/Practice Nurse.

Children in year 1, 2 & 3 are also eligible for flu vaccine this year.

KEY ANNUAL EVENTS

Last Friday, we sent a letter to you via Parent Mail. The letter contains all the key events that will take place in the 2016/17 academic year eg Parents' Evenings, Christmas and Summer Production, Assessment Weeks, Year Group Assembly dates, Sports Day etc. If you have not accessed your Parent Mail account and downloaded the phone APP please call in to the office - the staff will be very happy to help you. CORE VALUES

In order to help the children learn about democracy and voting the children will now vote (using a ballot paper!) for each core value. After our first election, the children voted as follows:

Friendship – 136, Peace – 46, Justice - 44, Truthfulness – 44, Generosity – 30 and Thankfulness – 22.

Therefore, our core value this term is FRIENDSHIP – we shine when we are a good friend. We aim to help the children to: Think how they can build lasting friendships;

Consider how they can help their friends in times of need;

Recognise that although they sometimes fall out with their friends their words and actions can restore friendships;

Value their friendships by valuing people over possessions;

Recognise that Jesus is their friend.

Certificates have been sent home today with children in Years 1 to 6. We would love to hear from you when your child exemplifies the value of FRIENDSHIP outside of school so that we can celebrate that in school too. The children will vote again towards the end of Autumn 1 for our Autumn 2 core value.

GOOD TO BE GREEN [GTBG] BEHAVIOUR SYSTEM

Today the children in Years 1 to 6 heard all about this year's GTBG behaviour reward system. The reward this year will be coloured rosettes which will be a different colour each term - red, orange, yellow, green, blue and violet.

We recognise that, from time to time, children may make the wrong choice and therefore a child will still receive a termly reward (the appropriate coloured rosette) if they remain green for the term or if they have received one or two amber warning cards in that term.

If a child has stayed 'green' (i.e. has not received any amber or red cards) <u>all</u> academic year then s/he will be awarded a special rosette at the end of the school year. The School Council will choose the final design in the summer term.

This new system is effective from Monday 12th September. Therefore, any children who have received an amber or red card to date will be given a fresh start so that they can aspire to receiving a red rosette.

Children in RJB and RLW will spend the Autumn terms settling in and understanding the language of the behaviour system. They will join the reward system in January 2017. A letter will go out to parents of children in RJB and RLW once the behaviour system has been introduced to the children

HOUSE CAPTAINS

The role of House Captain and Vice House Captain form part of the additional responsibilities given to Year Six children. To be able to undertake this very important role in school, the children had to give a campaign speech to all the children in their house and keep their fingers crossed that they were nominated!

Congratulations to the following children who were elected by their peers; 2 children received the same number of votes and so, for the first time, we have 2 Vice House Captains for one of the houses.
