ATTENDANCE

All children are expected to be in their classrooms by 8.55am, arriving after this time can have an impact on their social development and learning. Did you know that arriving 5 minutes late every day adds up to 3 days lost a year, 10 minutes adds up to 6 days lost, 15 minutes adds up to 10 days lost, 20 minutes adds up to 13 days lost a year, and 30 minutes adds up to 19 days lost a year.
