CORE VALUES

As part of learning about democracy and how to vote, children in years one to six voted for the core value they wanted to be in focus next term. The results are: Peace – 74, Justice – 71, Truthfulness – 68, Generosity – 49 and Thankfulness – 44. There were 32 spoilt ballot papers as some of us marked our papers with a tick instead of a cross. It is important that we use this learning opportunity to vote correctly!

Therefore, our core value next term will be PEACE – we shine when we live in peace with others. Peace, in the sense of total well-being, is God's intention for the whole of creation, and is a promise that awaits ultimate fulfillment.

We aim to:

Help children to appreciate quietness and take time for calm reflection;

Support the children in finding ways to solve their differences in constructive ways;

Develop children's skills as peacemakers;

Introduce children to the concepts of 'peace with God' and 'the peace of God';

Look at issues of peace and justice locally and internationally.

ADMISSION TO ST. PETER'S HIGH SCHOOL IN SEPTEMBER 2017

The admission procedure will soon close for current Year 6 pupils. St Peter's High School no longer requires parents to complete an information form. However, they do require a copy of either your child's baptismal certificate or first Holy Communion certificate to be given directly to them. The closing date for both the local authority common application form (to be completed online unless a paper copy has been requested from the local authority) and the documentation for the high school is 31st October 2016.
