SUNDAY 18th DECEMBER: THE FOURTH SUNDAY OF ADVENT

On Sunday, the Church will celebrate the Fourth Sunday of Advent. We light the last purple candle on our Advent wreath and our preparation for Christmas is almost finished. Today we remember Mary's great act of selflessness and devotion to God. We thank her for becoming the mother of Jesus and for sharing her Son with the world.

The final candle on the advent wreath (the white one) will be lit on **Christmas day** – this candle celebrates Jesus as the light of the world – when we rejoice at the birth of our Lord and Saviour.
