PSHCE

On Monday, Rosie from Konflux Theatre came in to deliver 'A Play in a Day' with a group of 32 children across Key Stage 2. The play was called 'Peace of Mind', based on mental illness, a topic very much in the news at the moment. 1 in 4 adults are affected by mental illness in one way or another throughout their lives and around one in ten children experience mental health problems. The play explored how, who and where to get support, how to support another person with a mental illness and emotional triggers.

The topic was delivered using inventive theatre techniques such as choral speech, stylised movement and mime. At the end of the day the children gave a performance to the whole school and their parents. It was amazing to see how children from a range of year groups worked together to produce a play in such a short amount of time.

On Friday 27th January the PFA and the Indian community will be hosting a Family Curry night, from 7.00 - 9.30pm. CORE VALUES

As part of learning about democracy and how to vote, children in years one to six voted for the core value they wanted to be next in focus. The results are: Justice – 98, Truthfulness – 96, Generosity – 67 and Thankfulness – 55. There were 16 spoilt ballot papers as some of us marked our papers with a tick instead of a cross and others had more than one cross. We will continue to work on reducing the number of spoilt ballot papers – if we learn correctly now, then our vote will be counted when we vote in our wider community when we are 18. If we spoil our ballot papers we CAN ask for a new one.

Therefore, our core value this term will be **JUSTICE** – we shine when we strive for justice. We will look at how in the context of the Bible justice is always seen in the context of love. It includes the call to take responsibility for one another, especially the poor and the repressed, and to see that no-one is excluded from the essentials of life. We will look at how charities seek to make life fairer for those who live in difficult circumstances. Within their own lives the children will be encouraged to reflect on ways in which they can befriend others who are feeling left out, how they can help others who are not being treated fairly and forgive others who have done wrong.

Please use the core value certificate that your child has brought home today to share with us when your child demonstrates the core value of JUSTICE at home, for example:

Sally donated her pocket money to a local charity;

Ben decided that he wanted one less birthday present so that one could be donated to a local children's home;

Alice noticed that a child in the park was playing on her own and went over to play with her.

Gary forgave his cousin for not letting him join in with his game.
