#### PURPLE MASH FESTIVE CARD COMPETITION

Purple Mash is running an exciting Christmas competition for children to enter - to design the official Purple Mash festive card. Everyone is welcome to enter and the design can represent whatever this time of year means to your child.

To enter, children need to go to our school website, click on' Children's Area', then go to the bottom of the page and click on the 'Purple Mash' link. They can then log in using their username and password. The Christmas card has been set as a "to do" for every child in the school. They can save their work and come back to it as often as they like before submitting it. Once they are happy with their design they need to click on the top right hand icon (which looks like a world) to share their work. They can then submit their design to the under 8s or under 12s Festive card competition.

The competition display boards will be visible to the public, so it's important that children do not include personal information in their entries. Any entries that include personal information won't be accepted or displayed on the board. The only information visible on the board will be the school name.

The winning designs from each category (under 8's and under 12's) will be professionally printed and become the official 2Simple festive cards. The winning child will receive 50 copies of the card to give out to their friends and family plus a t-shirt with their design printed on it. The school will receive an additional 250 copies of the card.

The closing date for entries is 26th November. Good luck everyone!

#### **YEAR 3 TRIP TO STONEHENGE**

On Wednesday 8th November, Year 3 went to Stonehenge to learn more about life in the Prehistoric Period.

The children solved challenges around the Stones, learning about the different types of stones, their purposes and how they developed over time.
