SCHOOL UNIFORM

The governors set the school uniform policy.

For the month of September children are allowed to wear the summer uniform - summer dresses or grey tailored shorts. Please note that playsuits are not school uniform and therefore should not be worn to school.

Children must wear school shoes. Black trainers and black boots are not school uniform.

Children may have 2 lengths of haircut and the shortest cut must be no shorter than a grade 2. Shaved heads, mohican hair cuts, tramlines and other shaved markings are not acceptable.

If your child is not wearing the correct school uniform your child's teacher will speak to you. Please respect our school uniform policy. Thank you.



GOOD TO BE GREEN [GTBG] BEHAVIOUR SYSTEM

Today the children in Years 1 to 6 heard all about this year's GTBG behaviour reward system. The reward this year will be coloured postcards which will be a different colour each term - red, orange, yellow, green, blue and violet.

We recognise that, from time to time, children may make the wrong choice and therefore a child will still receive a termly reward (the appropriate coloured postcard) if they remain green for the term or if they have received one or two amber warning cards in that term.

If a child has stayed 'green' (i.e. has not received **any** amber or red cards) **all** academic year then s/he will be awarded a special reward at the end of the school year.

This new system is effective from Monday 10th September. Therefore, any children who have received an amber or red card to date will be given a fresh start so that they can aspire to receiving a red rosette.

Children in RJB and RAE will spend the Autumn terms settling in and understanding the language of the behaviour system. They will join the reward system in January 2019. A letter will go out to parents of children in RJB and RAE once the behaviour system has been introduced to the children.
