OPAL – OUTDOOR PLAY AND LEARNING

OPAL (Outdoor play and learning) is now well under way and the children are having some wonderful outdoor play experiences. We are now beginning our first OPAL winter, where the weather is colder and much wetter and there is plenty of mud around. Therefore, to keep your children's clothes from getting wet and muddy it is highly recommended that you supply them with the appropriate clothing as detailed below.

Essentials: It is **essential** that all children are kitted out with **waterproof coats** and **wellingtons** (clearly named) to stay in school every day so that the children can access all areas in all weather and get the most out of their OPAL experience. **Recommended:** As many of the zones are muddy there is a strong possibility of clothing getting wet and dirty. Waterproof trousers and/or a change of clothes are highly recommended to protect their school clothes.
