FANTASTIC NEWS - TWO GREAT REASONS TO CELEBRATE

Dear Parents, I am delighted to inform you of two great reasons to celebrate:

Wellbeing Award For Schools: Over the last 2 academic years we have introduced a number of initiatives to improve wellbeing for all in our school community. We have introduced the daily mile, trained 2 staff members to deliver THRIVE, we ensure that all pupils access quality PE, we offer pastoral support to all our families and we have introduced OPAL at lunchtimes. We deliver Jigsaw as part of our PSHCE programme and hold regular assemblies throughout the year on the key topics in this programme. We also invite the NSPCC to speak to the children about Childline and the local PCSOs lead assemblies about online safety. In addition to this we celebrate Online Safety week in March as well as regular revisions of this in class throughout the year. The assessor was very impressed with the range and quality of wellbeing provision. Whilst all in our school family have contributed to the different elements which allowed us to secure this award, we would like to express our sincerest thanks to Mrs Brogan and Mrs Desando for leading on and completing all the paperwork required to receive this award.

If you are an EU, EEA or Swiss citizen or have a family member who is, you may well need to apply to the EU Settlement Scheme to continue to live, work and study in the UK. TAKING HOLIDAY IN TERM TIME

Even though the much lower cost of holidays during children's school term times encourages many families to look into the idea of taking their child out of school during the academic year, the first thing to note is, the law does not allow this! The law does not grant parents an automatic right to take their child out of school during term time. Our main concern is that any absence from school will disrupt your child's learning. Children returning from a term time holiday are unprepared for the lessons that they have missed. The Department for Education only allows a Headteacher discretion to consider an absence/holiday in term time in "special circumstances". Very few requests fall into this category.

Any holiday or absence during term time must be submitted on the school's Request for Absence during School Term Form which can be found on the school website or from the school office. A response will be sent to you as soon as possible. If the request is not considered to be a special circumstance, and you nevertheless take your child out of school, the absence will be recorded as unauthorised. In the case of an unauthorised absence/holiday, the Education and Inclusion Team at Shire Hall will be notified of the unauthorised absence/holiday taken, and a Penalty Notice will be issued.

Please note that such a penalty is issued to <u>each</u> parent for <u>each</u> child taken out of school. A Penalty Notice is a fine of £60 per parent per child, which increases to £120 per parent per child if not paid within 21 days. If the Penalty Notice remains unpaid after 28 days, this may result in legal action and ultimately a criminal record.
