#### **ADMISSION TO RECEPTION IN SEPTEMBER 2020**

Starting School? If you have a child born between 1<sup>st</sup> September 2015 and 31<sup>st</sup> August 2016, you will be able to apply for a place at our school for admission from September 2020 onwards. You must complete an application form that will be available from the school admissions team of Gloucestershire County Council from 4<sup>th</sup> November 2019. If your child is a baptised Catholic, you must also provide a copy of the baptism certificate to the school, even if you already have a child attending our school. Please ensure you apply by the closing date of 15<sup>th</sup> January 2020.





#### **CORE VALUES**

Our core value this term is JUSTICE - we shine when we strive for justice. We will look at how in the context of the Bible justice is always seen in the context of love. It includes the call to take responsibility for one another, especially the poor and the repressed, and to see that no-one is excluded from the essentials of life.
