'SMART' SECURITY CAMERAS – USING THEM SAFELY IN YOUR HOME

You may have heard in the news of cases where cyber criminals have been able to access security cameras and baby monitors to view live images. This is because they can be accessed remotely and are set with a well known password such as 0000. National Cyber Security Centre (NCSC) has issued some simple guidance:

- 1. If your camera comes with a default password, change it to a more secure one. NCSC recommend connecting three random words that will be easy for you to remember, but difficult for a cyber criminal to work out.
- 2. Keep your camera secure by regularly updating the software, and it would be best if you can set it so that these are done automatically. Note that software is sometimes referred to as firmware, so look for the words update, firmware or software within the app.
- 3. If you do not need the feature that lets you remotely view camera footage via the internet, disable it. Note that this may prevent you receiving alerts when movement is detected and could stop the camera working with smart home devices.

CORE VALUES

Our core value this term will be TRUTHFULNESS. We shine when we tell the truth. We will help the children to understand that it is important that we are truthful with small things so that people will trust us later with bigger, more important things. If you don't tell the truth, people are not always sure of you and they cannot rely on you.

Telling the truth can sometimes be difficult, for example if we admit we have broken something we should own up and say it was us so that other people do not get into trouble. Telling the truth may be awkward, for example if someone asks you whether something suits them and it does not. In this instance we could choose our words carefully so we tell the truth but don't hurt the person's feelings. Telling the truth can also make you different from other people, for example you may pretend to follow the same football team or like the same music just to be like everyone else but this is not being truthful to your beliefs.

God knows that it is difficult to be truthful all the time, but if we ask Him through prayer He will help us.
