OCTOBER – THE MONTH OF THE ROSARY

The ROSARY is devotion in honour of the Blessed Virgin Mary. The word Rosary comes from Latin and means a garland of roses, the rose being one of the flowers used to symbolise Mary. The ROSARY is a meditation. When Catholics pray the Rosary they meditate on the mystery associated with each decade. The Rosary is divided into five decades. Each decade represents a mystery or event in the life of Jesus. There are four sets of "Mysteries of the Rosary":

The Joyful Mysteries: the Annunciation, the Visitation, the Nativity, the Presentation of Jesus in the Temple and the Finding of the child Jesus in the Temple.

The Sorrowful Mysteries: the Agony in the Garden, the Scourging, the Crowning with Thorns, the Carrying of the Cross and the Crucifixion.

The Glorious Mysteries: the Resurrection, the Ascension, the Descent of the Holy Spirit, the Assumption of Mary into heaven and her Coronation.

The Luminous Mysteries: The Baptism of the Lord, The wedding at Cana, The Proclamation of the Kingdom, The Transfiguration and The Institution of the Eucharist.

MORNING DROP OFF

We have noticed that the morning drop off is not running to the allocated schedule (Y5/6 8.35am, Y1/2 8.45am & Y3/4 8.55am), however it is working well as parents and children are arriving at staggered times and this means there is a constant flow as opposed to crowds of people arriving at any one given time. Therefore, with effect from Monday 5th October the scheduled morning arrival times will cease. Parents/carers of children particularly in Y3/4 may bring your children to school at any time after 8.35am. Please note that the classrooms do not open until 8.40am so please consider this when dropping your children off at school every morning. Thank you for your co-operation and understanding.

AFTERNOON COLLECTION TIMES

We need all parents to fully support us at collection times. Please wear a face mask (unless exempt) when coming on to the school site and please do not arrive at school until your child's allocated collection time:-

Y1 parents will not be allowed in until all the Y1 children are standing on their allocated number.

Y4 parents – please can we ask that when you arrive at school you form an orderly queue along the yellow socially distanced lines. Please do not gather directly outside the main gate until called forward as we will now be operating the queueing system. This will allow the Y1 parents and children to leave the school site safely.

Y2 parents – EYFS parents will be collecting their children from the same collection point at 3pm, so Y2 parents are asked to wait outside the main vehicle gates until the EYFS parents and children have left the school site.

1. Please keep your toddlers and children with you at all times. Please do not allow them to run up and down between the parked cars or up and down the bank.
2. Please do not sit on or lean against the cars in the car park.

- Please observe the 2m social distancing protocol at all times.
