BEWARE: INCREASED TRAIN TRAFFIC AT LEVEL CROSSINGS

Engineering work in the Bristol area means trains are being diverted via Gloucester between 24 October and 7 November.

Network Rail is working on behalf of South Gloucestershire Council to replace a railway bridge as part of the council's Cribbs Patchway Metrobus extension project. The work means that there will be a significant increase in high-speed trains on the line in this area every day between 24 October and 7 November, as all freight trains and some passenger trains will be diverted via Gloucester.

Please take extra care at and around level crossings. Where there are barriers, please allow extra time to travel as they will be down more often than usual.
