

HEALING HANDS





ASH WEDNESDAY AND LENT

Next Wednesday, 17th February, is Ash Wednesday. It is the first day of Lent, the season of preparation for the resurrection of Jesus Christ on Easter Sunday. During Lent we will encourage the children to make Lenten promises e.g. giving up sweets/fizzy drinks/chocolate etc or to do something positive eg doing messages every Saturday for mum/dad/gran/neighbour; making their bed every morning etc. We would really appreciate your help and support in encouraging your child to make a Lenten promise and keep it throughout the Lenten period. We would also encourage all families to try to make a special time to pray together during Lent. These Lenten promises remind the children of Jesus' sacrifice - he died to save us from our sins and so that we can share eternal life with him in Heaven.

CORE VALUES

As part of learning about democracy and how to vote, those children in years one to six who were in school on polling day this week voted for the core value that they would like to be in focus next term. The results are: Generosity – 30, Compassion – 23 and Humility – 21.

Therefore, our core value next term will be GENEROSITY – we shine when we are generous. We will help the children to understand that:

Generosity is best described as giving freely without limit or conditions;

We can be generous with our words, actions, and time;

The way in which we give to others is important. If we give grudgingly we will feel miserable and resentful. If we give cheerfully we will feel happy at seeing others blessed;

Generosity, once experienced and acknowledged by an individual, can in turn release a generous spirit towards others;

Generous acts can bring their own rewards in terms of friendship and happiness, while being selfish can lead to isolation and rejection.
