ONE YEAR ANNIVERSARY OF COVID-19

On Tuesday 23rd March, we had a special assembly to mark the first anniversary of going into lockdown. During the assembly we discussed how our lives have changed:

- Hand washing
- Hand gel going into the supermarket and having to queue
- The wearing of face masks
- Restaurants, parks, cinemas, shops, hairdressers are closed
- Bubbles in school, sitting facing forward, sanitising the desks and chairs regularly, playing in an allocated spaces, assembly via Teams in the classroom etc

And we also discussed how lives, in genereal, may have improved:

- People becoming more patient
- People becoming more aware of others and becoming more engaged in their community
- People engaging in acts of kindness
- The roll out of the vaccine and the hope that gives to everyone

As part of the assembly we all watched a reflective video, with pictures of what has happened over the last year, and then we all stood for the 1 minute's silence to remember all those who have lost their lives to Covid-19. Following the assembly, every class planted a pansy in the main garden and next week (when our order arrives) every child will plant a snowdrop, crocus or wild primrose plants in this garden—we will then have a rainbow of colourful flowers which will bloom every year in the spring and these will remind us of our coronavirus journey.

Once restrictions have been lifted we will provide all our parents with the opportunity to plant a bulb in this garden too.
