

Climbing Net

Well, after a year in the planning, the new addition to our OPAL experience is finally up and ready to be explored by our excited pupils. During the 1st lockdown last year, the pupils missed many sporting opportunities and as a result there were funds earmarked for sporting events that were not spent. This new climbing frame was funded through this underspend and is a legacy of the lockdown that will give our pupils an exciting, physically and mentally challenging experience for years to come. The net is age appropriate for all our pupils, they have been fully briefed on the safety protocols and many have already had a chance to experience it during class Active 15 time. As OPAL is back to normal from next week, many more will have the chance to experience it's challenges first hand and all are very excited.



Free School Meals

Your children might be eligible for Free School Meals (FSM) if you get certain

benefits. For an up to date list of these, please read the Frequently Asked Questions section in the link at the bottom of this page. When your child is on the FSM register, the school is given extra funding, and this is called Pupil Premium. Pupil Premium can be used by the school in a variety of ways to help support your child's learning (human and physical resources) but it can also be used to support the funding of 'extras' such as your child's educational trips or music lessons.

If your application for Free School Meals is successful, your child will be entitled to a free school meal every day and the school will receive the Pupil Premium funding while your child is at our school. If your financial circumstances change and your child is taken off Free School Meals the school still receives the Pupil Premium funding because the funding stays with the child for 6 years (this is called 'Ever 6'). This will more than likely mean that your child will continue to benefit in secondary school. The application process is really simple, and can be done online through the link below. It is the same login you used to apply for a Primary School place, you only need your NI number, and you get an answer straight away.

Please note that FSM is not the same as Universal Infant Free School Meals (UIFSM), where children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 are automatically entitled to a free school meal, so if your child is in one of these year groups, it is still worth applying.

ACTION RESEARCH PROJECT—YEAR 6

Mrs Young and Mrs Jackson are currently undertaking an Action Research Project designed to explore ways in which feedback is given to children. Part of this project involves considering an alternative to certificates so that children's successes are celebrated regularly, building a child's self-esteem, resilience and determination to always do their best. We discussed weekly certificates with the children and then we introduced them to the alternative - their very own 'Positivity/Compliments Book' where they record what they are proud of every week. They also receive a compliment in this book from their Learning Partner (this is a different person every week) about how they have supported their Partner in their learning over the course of each week.

Mrs Young and Mrs Jackson had a very open discussion with the children about the current certificate system, and while they said they like to receive a certificate they know that they probably only get about 2 certificates per year whereas with this 'Positivity/Compliments Book' they are receiving feedback all the time. The children were excited about this alternative and have agreed to trail this until July. During the trial we will seek their views/opinions/feedback and use this information to inform our next steps.

The children started their 'Positivity/Compliments Books' on our return to school in January and so from this week onwards, Y6 children will not receive weekly certificates. Instead, when you come into school for 'Prepare to be Proud' events and any other class based events, you will be able to see your child's book and celebrate their on-going successes with them.

GSSN CROSS COUNTRY CHAMPIONSHIPS



This Monday, 60 pupils from years 2-6 took part in the annual GSSN Cross Country championships. There were 23 schools (around 1300 pupils) competing this year and the St Peter's team had some good individual results against some very stiff competition. The day was a long and cold one, with each pupils running 1 race that lasted approximately 10 minutes but the pupils responded superbly to the challenge. Our pupils were impeccably behaved, as always, gave maximum effort at all times and were great ambassadors for the school. Apologies that we don't have photos of the year group teams but the iPad ran out of charge half way through the day. Certificates will be given

During the February holiday period, Gloucestershire County Council is providing vouchers to parents who have signed up to our Holiday Free School Meals (FSM) scheme. These vouchers are provided by Gloucestershire County Council as part of its commitment to 'no child goes hungry'. The vouchers are funded through COVID-19 grant funding we have received and is separate to that of the term time free school meals.

Parents who have signed up to the scheme will receive a voucher for £15 for each child who is eligible for FSM which will cover the February holiday.

Parents who have signed up previously do not need to re-register, they have already been included, but, to ensure we get all who are eligible, we are encouraging new parents to sign up as soon as they can.

Applications for Holiday Free School Meal Vouchers for the February half term period is now open until the 14th February. Voucher emails will be sent out between **15th and 16th of February.** Please encourage parents to also check their junk/spam email folders during this period as sometimes the vouchers end up there. If parents have not received their vouchers by then please encourage them to get in contact with us by emailing childrensfund@gloucestershire.gov.uk.
