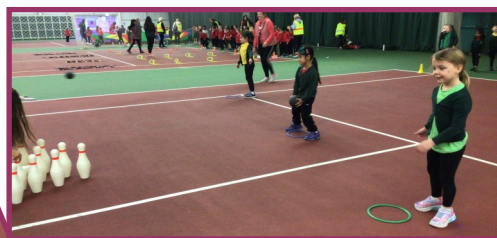

School Dinners

We are very grateful when parents keep their dinner accounts in credit on ParentPay; thank you. Dinners are £2.34 per day, or £11.70 per week.

Your children might be eligible for Free School Meals (FSM) if you receive any of the following:

- **Income Support**
- **income-based Jobseeker's Allowance**
- **income-related Employment and Support Allowance**
- **support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999**
- **the guaranteed element of Pension Credit**
- **Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)**
- **Working Tax Credit run-on - paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit**
- **Universal Credit—your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)**

When your child is on the FSM register, the school is given extra funding, and this is called Pupil Premium. Pupil Premium can be used by the school in a variety of ways to help support your child's learning, and it can also be used to support the funding of 'extras' such as your child's trips or music lessons.

Your child is eligible for Pupil Premium for six years after they are no longer on the Free School Meals register. This will more than likely mean that your child will continue to benefit in secondary school. The application process is really simple, and can be done online through the link below. It is the same the login details you used to apply for a primary school place, you only need your NI number, and you get an answer straight away.

Please note that FSM is NOT the same as Universal Infant Free School Meals (UIFSM), where children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 are automatically entitled to a free school meal. If your child is in one of these year groups, it is still really worth applying.
