#### **Gloucester Feed The Hungry**


During Live Love Learn week, each year group had the opportunity to think about our neighbours in the community. While looking at the meaning of our Core Values, we

#### REDUCE, REUSE, RECYLCE

During our Live Love Learn week at the end of last term, every class learnt about the importance of looking after the beautiful world God gave us. The children know that if they

- turn the tap off when they are actually brushing their teeth then they are REDUCING the amount of water that is being wasted.
- REUSE plastic bags when they go shopping with their parents then they are helping to
   REDUCE the amount of plastic in the world
- RECYCLE items they are helping to REDUCE waste and REUSE a range of materials

#### **ECO BRICKS**



The LIVE LOVE LEARN In Action Club are making ECO-BRICKS. These are made by stuffing single use plastic and non-recyclable plastic into 2 litre plastic bottles. It takes a long time to fill one 2 litre bottle as the plastic has to be really compact inside—this is achieved by poking it down with a large stick. Please check plastic wrappers (particularly on fruit and veg) and if they have the NOT

YET RECYCLABLE icon please can you send this into school alternatively you may wish to make your own eco-bricks at home.
