Next week is Children's Mental Health Week from **7 - 13 February** and the theme is GROWING TOGETHER, encouraging children to consider how they have grown and how they can help others to grow. During this week, we will be revisiting the 5 Ways to Wellbeing; Connect, Take Notice, Give, Keep Learning and Be Active and the children will be exploring ways in which we can use strategies to help with our Mental Health. On Friday 11th, your child is invited to bring in an **individual healthy snack** (fruit, snack bar, carton of orange juice NO NUTS PLEASE) to share in class from 8:35 until 9:05am so that they can have an extra breakfast with their class, **this is in addition to the breakfast that they would have at home before school**. The reason for this activity is to give the children a chance to connect with each other during the most important meal of the day, breakfast; fuelling our minds and bodies.

On Friday 11th February, St Peter's Catholic Primary School will also be taking part in EXPRESS YOURSELF day, so your child is invited to dress in their brightest clothes or favourite outfit. We're asking families to donate £1 (or however much they can give) to support 2 charities which are important to our school community. Firstly, the **Heart Heroes** charity which supports children with congenital heart disease (CHD), in our school, the family of Naayt in EYFS. It is one of the most common types of birth defect, affecting up to 8 in every 1,000 babies born in the UK. 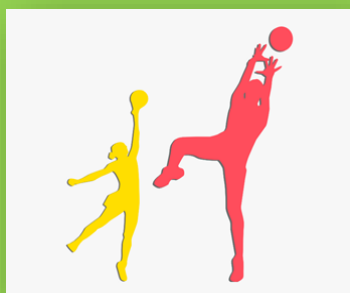
