

Revelation

This is what your child will be learn during the Revelation unit.

Reception

Children will be introduced and explore the role of the Church in getting to know God. In doing this they will look at the priest and the symbols in the church e.g the stations, the lectern etc. They will also explore the idea of God's love for us and how Jesus showed love to people by listening to some of the stories from the Bible.

Help At Home

- When you visit the church discuss that this is God's house. Look for the things that tell you it is Gods house and make links with how people tell your house apart from someone else's.
- Talk about who the Priest is and how he teaches us about God.
- Walk around the church and identify how many symbols of God/ Jesus they can find.

Year 1

Children will focus on stories from the Bible that show how special Jesus was. They will learn to understand what a parable is and what a miracle is. They will look in detail at the feeding of the 5,000 and the parable of the Good Samaritan. They will discuss what the stories are telling us about Jesus and the impact on how we should behave and act.



Help At Home

- Read a fable such as the tortoise and the snail and talk about it being a story but that it has a message. Make a link with the story of the Good Samaritan.
- Ask the children to tell you each day how they have shown they are a Good Samaritan like Jesus and you could also tell them how you have been one.
- Children could keep a list of all the things they have done over a period of time

Year 2

The children will explore more parables and miracles that show how special Jesus and that the Kingdom of God is present within him. They will particularly focus on the parable of the sower. They will look at the characteristics of Jesus e.g: the teacher and the healer, and explore how he helps the vulnerable. They will also look at the wedding at Cana and what this shows about the relationship with Mary his mother.

Help at home

- Talk about the kinds of people Jesus may have helped if he were with us today. E.g: the homeless and refugees. Ask them if they feel Jesus would want us to help them and how can we do that.
- Read some of the parables and miracles from the Bible and ask them which is a miracle, which is a parable and explain why they say this.
- Ask them if they could teach people something, what it would be?

Year 3

In this unit the children will develop understanding of the parts of the Mass specifically how Sacred Scripture proclaims ways in which we are saved and how it reveals God. It explores the response of Samuel to God's plan and considers what we can learn from it. It introduces work on the Presentation of our Lord in the temple and the Baptism of Jesus to enable pupils to begin to explore how people recognised God's revelation of Himself in Jesus.



Help at Home

- Talk to your child about the Lectern and that this is where God's word is proclaimed through the readings and the specifically the Gospel.
- Look at when the Presentation of Christ is celebrated.

Year 4

This unit considers two examples of God's revelation of Himself in Jesus. It explores and develops children's understanding of the transfiguration and makes links with the Trinity e.g. the father, Son and Holy Spirit. It also develops the symbolism of light to show the presence of the Holy Spirit.

Help at Home

- Read with them the transfiguration story in the Bible and make a link with making the sign of the cross and the Trinity.
- Talk to them about their feelings when they are in the dark and in the light. Ask them to explain why they feel how they do.
- Go for a short walk in the dark and use a torch to find your way. Turn the torch out for a bit and see what happens.



Year 5

This unit considers the recognition of God's revelation of Himself in Jesus, by John the Baptist. The children will deepen their understanding of the purpose and impact of Jesus's baptism and identity that it was the start of his ministry. They will explore the impact and purpose of their own baptism and how links with parables provide us with guidance on how to undertake that ministry. They will also develop an understanding of the term God's Kingdom.

Help at Home

- Allow your child to choose one or two parables to read together or to you and get them to explain the message and how this helps us in our ministry. E.g. how we behave and what we should be telling others.
- Look at their own Baptism and the words that are said- what do they really mean?



Year 6

This unit examines the conversion of St Paul. The impact of this conversion to himself, on those around him and the Church are considered. The children will consider what is meant by 'Apostolic Tradition' and the role of Bishops and Popes.

Help at Home

- Look up famous people who have become Christians and discuss why such people became Christians.
- Discuss the challenges famous people have in standing up for their faith. Ask your child if they find it difficult to admit they are Catholic/Christian or have a faith to friends who don't.
- Find out more about who Saul/St Paul was, not just the conversion story.
- Write a biography of Paul for young children.
