The Feast of The Epiphany



On 6th January every year, the church celebrates the Feast of the Epiphany. The word Epiphany means a great revelation. The great revelation is that Jesus is the Son of God and the Son of Man.

We celebrate this revelation with the visit of the wise men who offer gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh. Each of these precious gifts has a symbolic meaning. Frankincense was used for worship in the Temple; it is symbolic of Christ the High Priest. Gold is symbolic of Christ the King. Myrrh a perfume, was used to anoint dead bodies, it is symbolic of His death for the sake of truth, and therefore of Christ the Prophet.

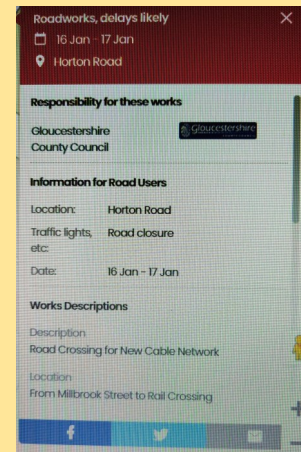
