

Soft Plastic Recycling at Supermarkets

The school Eco Council members carried out a litter pick at the end of last term. We discovered that most of the litter being dropped is soft plastics. Did you know that soft plastics can be dangerous to animals and take thousands of years to decompose? Many large supermarkets now offer soft plastic recycling in stores. Eco Council members would like to encourage families to collect their soft plastics at home and take them to be recycled when you go shopping.

Examples of plastics that you can recycle: plastic bags, crisp packets, biscuit wrappers, bar wrappers, cling film, cellophane and many more.
