

If your child has vomiting or diarrhoea, they need to remain off school for 48hrs AFTER the last incidence of sickness/diarrhea. Thank you for your co-operation.



If your child has a high temperature,/fever, please keep them off school until their temperature has returned to normal.



Colds and coughs: Children can come to school if they have a cold or a cough (but if they also have a high temperature they must stay at home). Please make sure they are well wrapped up, have a water bottle and a supply of tissues. Children will be reminded to 'Catch it, Bin it, Kill it' and they will be re-



minded to cough into the crook of their arm (not their hand). They will then be asked to wash their hands.



Please practice good handwashing skills with your child at home; we will also be doing this in school. Thank you.




Square Roots 04/10/23
