This gospel has lots of messages, the message we explored was about having the courage to do what we believe in.

MEASLES

Measles is a disease that spreads very easily, and the number of cases is increasing. People with measles can get a cough, runny nose, rash and fever. Measles can be serious, particularly for people whose immune system is not working normally. Measles usually start with cold-like symptoms, followed by a rash a few days later. Some may also get small white spots in their mouth. The rash looks brown or red on white skin. It may be harder to see on brown and black skin, but may appear purple or darker than surrounding skin. The best way to prevent measles is through vaccination. If you are not sure if you or your child has had the MMR (Measles, Mumps and Rubella) vaccination, please contact your GP surgery. 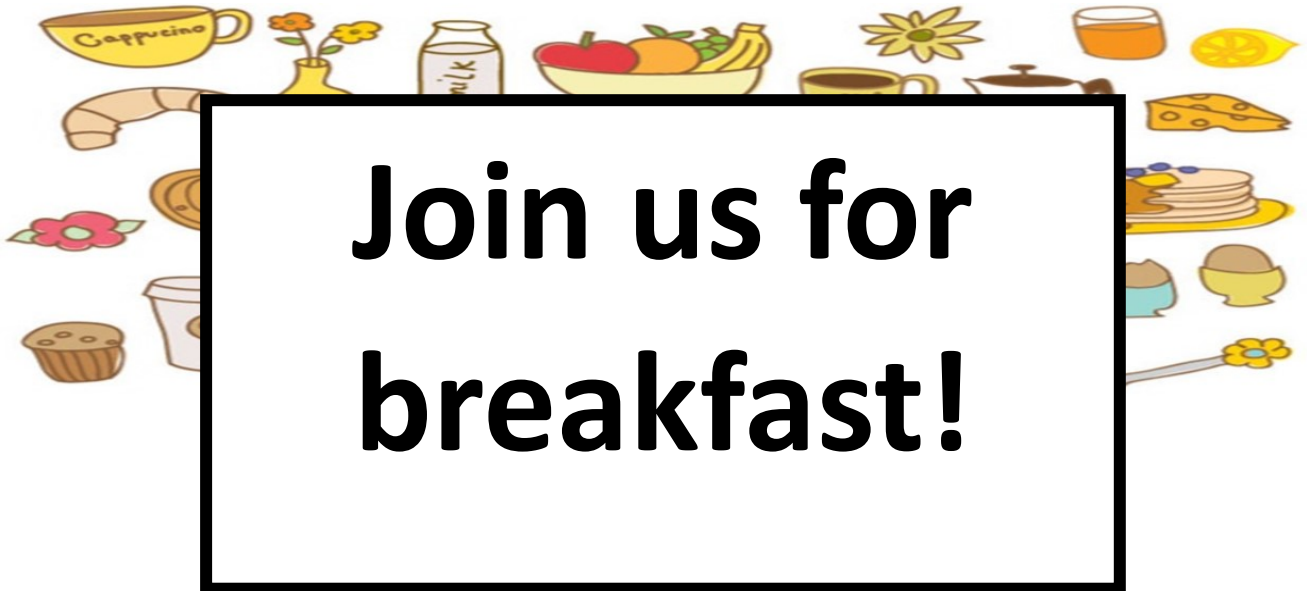
