Attendance

Just to remind you that the school gates are open from 8:25am, when your child can go straight to class. This means that they will be ready for the start of the school day at 8:45am. The first school bell is rung just before this. Children arriving after the second school bell, but before 9am are noted on the register as 'late'. Children arriving after 9am are noted as 'unauthorised absence' or U.

Punctuality plays such an important part throughout your whole life, and it starts at school. We look for ways in which we can assist you with this, if we find that a child is starting to become late, or is more absent from school than usual. We always want to work with parents in order to find the best solution.

Please would you ring school before 9am if your child is not going to be in for any reason.

This week, KS2 prepared for Confession with a Reconciliation Liturgy led by Miss Baker from St Peter's High School.



TAKING HOLIDAY IN TERM TIME

Even though the much lower cost of holidays during children's school term times encourages many families to look into the idea of taking their child out of school during the academic year, the first thing to note is, the law does not allow this!


Our main concern is that any absence from school will disrupt your child's learning. Children returning from a term time holiday are unprepared for the lessons that they have missed. The Department for Education only allows a Headteacher discretion to consider an absence/holiday in term time in "exceptional circumstances". Very few requests fall into this category.

Any holiday request must be submitted on the school's Request for Absence during School Term Form which can be found on the school website or from the school office. A response will be sent to you as soon as possible. If the request is not considered to be an exceptional circumstance, and you nevertheless take your child out of school, the absence will be recorded as unauthorised. In the case of an unauthorised absence/holiday, the Education and Inclusion Team at Shire Hall will be notified of the unauthorised absence/holiday taken, and a Penalty Notice will be issued.

Please note that such a penalty is issued to <u>each</u> parent for <u>each</u> child taken out of school. A Penalty Notice is a fine of £60 per parent per child, which increases to £120 per parent per child if not paid within 21 days. If the Penalty Notice remains unpaid after 28 days, this may result in legal action and ultimately a criminal record.
