Palm Sunday Celebration of the Word

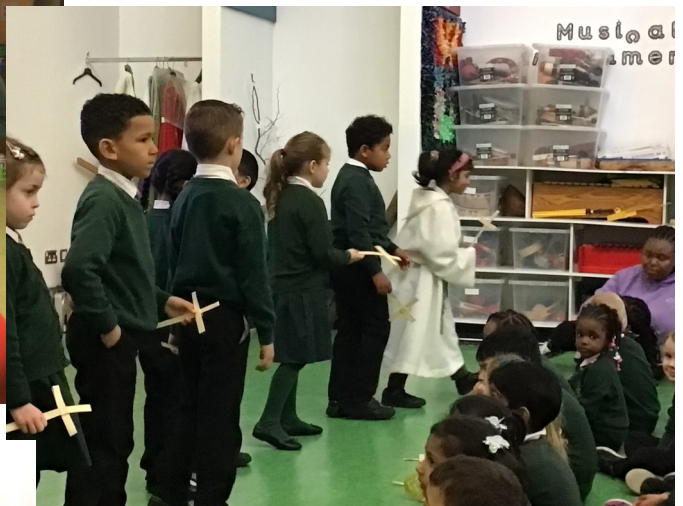
On Monday, we started the week with our fabulous KS1 Love Council re-enacting the events of Palm Sunday.

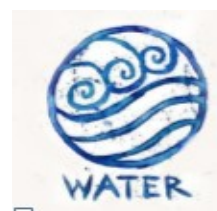
