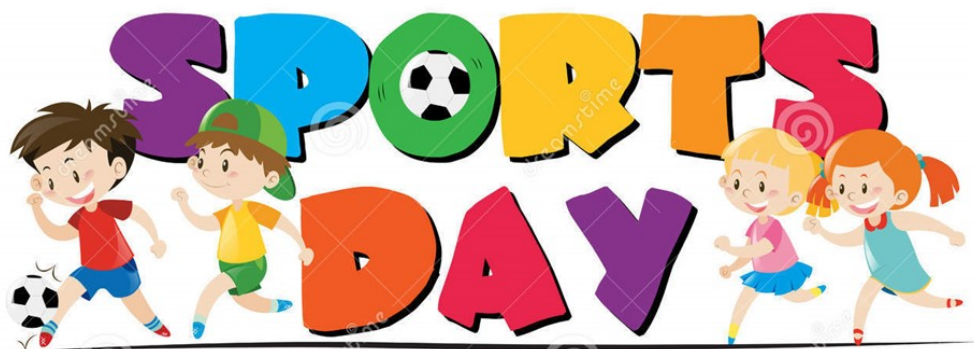

# FRIDAY, 14TH JUNE 2024

Dear Parents/Carers,

Our school sports day is a whole day event.

Parents/carers are welcome to go onto the school field from 8.55am.

You can pitch up anywhere on the outside perimeter of the field, except for the area in front of the big bank at the back of the field as this needs to be kept clear for the children. Thank you.

Don't forget to bring your picnic rugs, camping chairs, parasols and picnics.

Toilet facilities for parents/carers are in the Sports Pavillion – this is the building at the top of the slope half way down the field.

During the morning and lunch time break, the PFA will be selling hot and cold drinks, crisps, cakes, drinks and ice creams from the staff room (this is next to the Y3 classrooms).

School children can purchase items at lunchtime only. All children must bring their own snack and water bottle to school and these will be consumed at break time in their classrooms.

Running order for the day is as follows, and all timings are approximate:

9.15 - 10.40am	All children will complete a range of round robin activities. They will all earn house points in these activities.
10.40 – 11am	Break time Parents/carers and toddlers stay on the field. Parents/carers can purchase teas/coffees, cakes, crisps etc. All children will have break back in their classroom. Children will need their snack and their water bottle (as usual).
11.05am – 12.20pm	Year group races Parents/carers will stay on the left hand side of the field behind the 'Respect barrier' to watch the races and the children will sit on the right hand side of the field. Staff will be on hand to show parents/carers where to go.
12.20 – 12.30pm	All school children will return to their class.



12.30pm	<p><b>Parents/carers of children in EYFS, Year 1 and Year 2:</b> If your child is joining you for a picnic lunch you must go to your child's class to collect your child. If your child is having a cooked dinner, please collect your child from their classroom at 12.50pm.</p> <p><b>Parents/carers of children in Year 3, Year 4, Year 5 or Year 6:</b> If your child is joining you for a picnic lunch, then he/she will be allowed to go to the field and join you there. If they are having a cooked dinner they will join you on the field after they have eaten their dinner.</p>
12.30 – 1.20pm	<p><b>OPAL Zones</b> Children are only allowed on the field or the tarmac areas. Children are <b>not</b> allowed on the Bank Zone, Forest School Zone, Sand Pit/ Mud kitchen Zone. All school adults on duty during this time will be wearing high-viz vests.  The PFA will be selling refreshments and school children may buy an ice lolly during this time. Ice lollies are 50p.</p>
1.20 – 1.30pm	All children must return to class for afternoon registration.
1.30 – 2.50pm	Year group races Parents races (if time permits)
2.50pm	All children return to class.
3.10pm 3.15pm	End of day pick up as normal

Should the weather not be in our favour, the reserve day is Friday, 21<sup>st</sup> June.

Please take time to read the attached link about threadworms. <https://www.nhs.uk/conditions/threadworms/>

Threadworms are tiny worms in your poo. They are common in children and spread easily. You can treat them without seeing a GP. Your local pharmacy will be able to give you advice and provide medication.

Common symptoms can include:

Extreme itching around the anus or vagina particularly at night.

Irritability and waking up during the night.

Less common symptoms can include:

Weight loss.

Wetting the bed.

Irritated skin around the anus.

Please get advice and treatment if required to help to limit the spread in school.

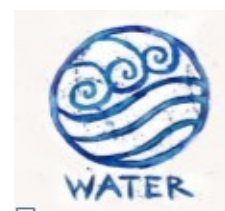

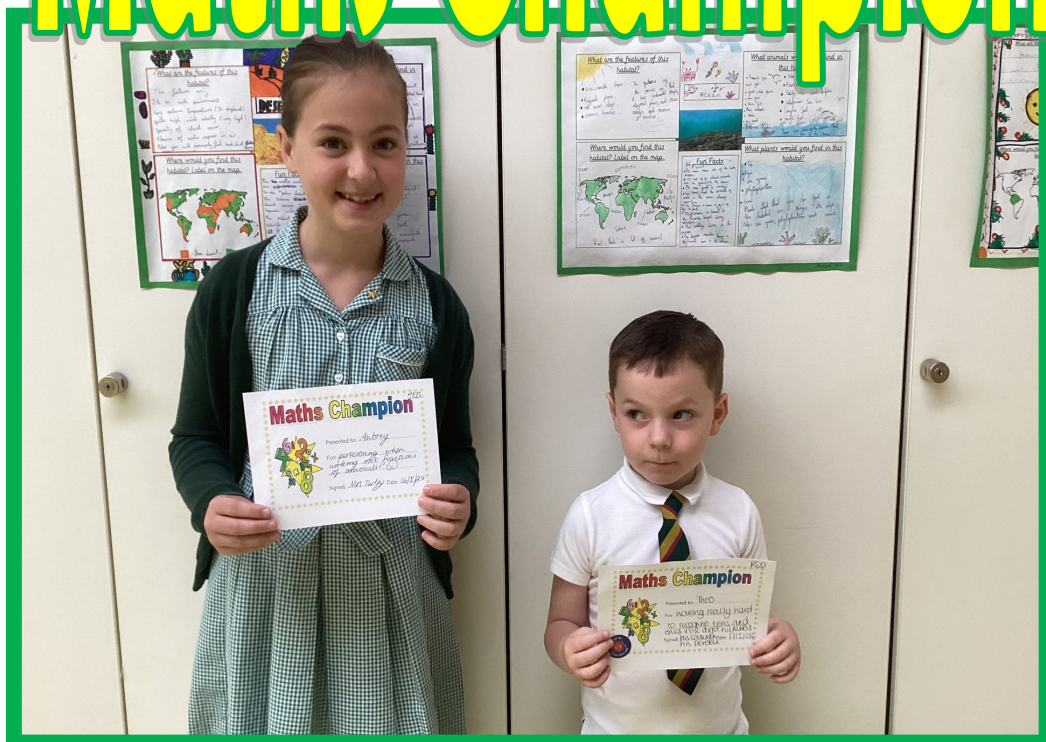
