Dear parents and carers,

It has been a really positive few weeks here at St. Peter's. The building has been calm and the children have been focused and engaged in their learning. The children have settled well, and it has been great to see them learning in the classrooms and to discuss their learning with them.

We have recently begun work to review the school's curriculum offer and we are formulating plans to strengthen the curriculum, particularly in the foundation subjects e.g. history, geography, art & design etc. This is exciting for all involved and we will keep you updated on these developments throughout the year. Alongside this, we will also be revisiting our whole-school approach to quality first teaching and adaptive teaching so that all our wonderful children can further benefit from high quality curriculum and teaching & learning in an inclusive manner. We are fortunate to have a highly effective and hard-working team, who are passionate about education and providing the very best opportunities for our fantastic children.

As a part of this, I am currently reviewing the existing arrangements for 'morning drop off' and learning activities at the very start of the day. It is my professional belief that this is a great time to get children in quickly and calmly, settle them with our morning prayers and begin the learning for the day.

If you would like to share feedback on this matter, then please do speak with me at the school gates or contact me via the school office.

We are also sharing information this week about Pupil Premium. I benefitted greatly from Free School Meals as a child and the additional support this brings to the school. I am keen to remove any stigma on this matter. Each child who qualifies for the Pupil Premium Grant brings over £1000 of additional income into the school. This money is provided to schools to improve the overall quality of education and this benefits all our children. If you believe you may be eligible or would like more information about Pupil Premium, then please contact the school office who will be able to provide guidance on how to apply. Applying is quick and easy and can be done online.

One of the many things the school currently does with Pupil Premium funding is heavily subsidise the cost of school trips and experiences. The school offers a wide range of trips and we are working hard behind the scenes to review and increase the opportunities children have here at St. Peter's. However, the school is currently making a significant in-year loss when funding this. We are only able to expand this offer if a greater number of parents and carers begin to make the contribution payment. This includes swimming. If we are unable to increase contributions, then the school may need to consider what it can afford to sustain. This may result in fewer trips and experiences.

As part of our new strategy to increase enrichment opportunities we have secured 180 tickets for all children in Years 4, 5 and 6 to attend the Cheltenham Literature Festival. The Cheltenham Literature Festival is an incredible experience and the children will be attending an interactive session with Greg Jenner, author of Chaotic History, where children will celebrate reading and writing through an engaging workshop.

I am delighted to share that we will be contacting parents and carers with information regarding the launch of our new enrichment and extra-curricular club offer. We will be offering a range of clubs (mostly for free) to children across the school. Clubs will run for 5 weeks at a time and will change on a half-termly basis. This offer will continue to grow and develop throughout the year and will include a range of sports, arts, dance, Lego club, and Pokémon club, amongst others. Please keep an eye out for further information regarding this next week.

In order to successfully run some of the clubs we are planning, we do need some additional resources. If you have any good quality Lego or Pokémon cards which you could donate to the school, then please can I kindly ask you to bring them to the school office. These resources will be kept at school and will be used to help deliver extra-curricular clubs.

You will no doubt have noticed that I am passionate about school attendance. Research demonstrates there is a direct correlation between attendance and pupil success. The Department for Education has recently updated its guidance on improving school attendance and Headteachers are being asked to challenge this and to improve attendance. Some parents may have already received letters from me advising them that their child's absence is classed as Persistent Absence; some parents have already met with me to agree improvement plans. If you are concerned about school attendance or would like some support or guidance to improve your child's attendance, then please do not hesitate to contact us. We are here to help and support.

Finally, well done to our school football teams this week. The girls' team represented the school with distinction in their Gloucester Schools fixture and the boys were competitive in the recent second group stage of the Gloucestershire County Schools competition. Well done to all of the children who have represented the school: you are a credit to St. Peter's.

Thank you to the parental community for such a warm welcome. I am really excited about the potential this school has and I look forward to working with you to make sure that each and every one of our children receives the very best education and pastoral care so they are able to flourish.
